Those of us who favor California natives choose those that are native to our area, especially when gardening next to natural native landscapes or beautifying roadsides. it's the responsibility of every caring garden club member to maintain California's natural beauty by preserving its regional native landscapes. When you think "Wildflowers" think of the most beautiful----think California Natives.



GOLDEN NOME AWARD & SWEEPSTAKE RIBBON





cial theme. See your yearbook for specific information and come join in on the fun. Also, look for color photographs on the web www.clttgc.org.


