**TIP #28** Eggshells make great seed starting pots.

**TIP #29** Try misting a mustard water tonic (1 Tbsp mustard in 1 qt warm water) to kill various insects feasting on vegetable leaves.

TIP #30 A hand-held bulb planter is perfect for planting potatoes.

**<u>TIP</u> #31** Aluminum foil reflects light which some insects can't stand. Place like mulch around squash, cukes, & corn.

**TIP #30** Bury a book of matches under each pepper plant for acidic soil.

THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES (Bear Berries--Little Apple)

down! I know that I have over a hundred manzanitas that add beautiful color, form and texture to your landscape. OH, it's the seedlings not the mature plants that bother you. Well, you must under-

stand that each of these miracles of nature started as a delicate urn shaped blossom borne in a decorative white to lavender raceme that you so admire. Thanks to our honeybees these blossoms are transformed into attractive clumps of fruit. You wonder what this has to do with the seedling problem in your yard. I was about to remind you of those song birds you so admire. You know the ones that feast on your manzanita berries and then sow the seeds in sort of a bird shot pattern. Transplanting those that must be relocated is done after the first fall rains and not later than mid-March. The root system must not be exposed so as to minimize shock. Deep once-a-week summer watering is required for the first year. You say, "pull the little pests out." That really hurts me, Josephine, and I'll tell you why. You see during the great depression them for the memories."

Now, now Josephine, calm while you city folks were cranking valves and flipping switches, us country folks were surviving by living off the land. That meant heating and cooking with fire wood from trees like that 15 foot arctostaphylos manzanita over there. See how it contrasts yet blends with its neighbors and how its grey-green leaves form a loose canopy revealing several gnarled trunks clothed in smooth, lustrous cinnamon brown bark. That is just one of 43 species of arctostaphylos that are native to California. "Josephine, can you see now why I'm driven by guilt and must return the favor by finding a good home for each of these beautiful creatures?" Of course I also recognize that this native is one of the most handsome. enduring and useful of California's native flora making it a very desirable cultivated They are truly a plant for all plant. seasons and many gardening situations.
