




# **ELY STAGE STOP**& COUNTY MUSEUM

Marva, Gladdy and Susan went to see Kate Marionchild at Watershed Bookstore after our November meeting. She had a wonderful slideshow and talked about man's relationship with poison oak as well as poison oak's relationship with other organisms. We discovered the roles played by lace lichen--the light green stuff that hangs from trees—and the dark green clumps of oak mistletoe often seen high in hardwood trees. We learned about the concepts "keystone species", "coevolution", and about the survival of great purple hairstreak butterflies, western bluebirds, wrentits, black-tailed deer, and more.
