

TORTELLINI SALAD...by Bonnie Brady

- 1 lb. Tortellini
- 1 C. Chopped mild Onion
- 1 C. Chopped Celery
- 1 C. Chopped mixed Vegetables (frozen OK)
- 1/2C. Mixed Fresh Herbs (I like Basil, Parsley, Oregano, Sage and Rosemary)

Bottled Ranch Dressing to taste- you can add more the next day as the pasta soaks it up.

Cook tortellini according to package directions for al dente stage. While the water is boiling, chop onion, celery, veggies & herbs. (If using frozen veggies, you can put them in for the last 2 minutes of cooking in the pasta water). Drain veggies and tortellini, rinse with cool water. When pasta is cool, add all ingredients, refrigerate. This is better the second day when the flavors have time to marry!

- **PROPOSED BUDGET DISCUSSION:** The Proposed Budget was passed out to all present.
- Linda Pyers motioned that we add \$50 to our budget for the Botanical Garden in Fort Bragg. Claire
 Grieve seconded the motioned. Motion passed by show of hands.
- Jo Shaul reported that the Ely Stage have volunteers and are able to maintain their own landscaping. She and Jerry did make a visit to check out the "boxes" and found that the Ely Stage people need to keep a better eye on the watering. Jo recommended that we drop that as a Club activity.
- * We need to know if we have a member that belongs to the Yacht Club. We can get a discount for the Mum Show for the building rental. Let Ginny know if we have a yacht club member. We had to add \$50 to the proposed budget for the yacht club rental just in case.
- * Claire Grieve said that she will co-ordinate the work sessions for Civic Beautification but will not be the only one doing the work. It was suggested that we do more than one project in work session.
- * Suzanne Russell reported that the Lakeport Westside Park is well organized and have grants and have too much going on already. <u>Barbara Swanson</u> <u>motioned that we do not add the Westside Park as</u> <u>one of our beautification projects. Suzanne Russell</u> <u>seconded the motion. Motion carried.</u>
- Debra O'Dell stated that to approve a budget that already appears to be in the red doesn't make logical sense. We need fund raisers to off-set our \$6524.00 deficit. All present agreed that another garden tour would be a great money raiser but no one has come forward to Chair it. Debra O'Dell, Maureen Brasier said they would be co-chairs; and Helen Turley and Irene Dudescu volunteered to be on the core committee. To be successful we have to have the whole club helping. With such enthusiasm perhaps we can pull it off again...this time be more specific as to the division of the profits. All at the meeting said that they had gotten positive feedback from all who attended and everyone wants us to do it again. We all agree that Susan Buckles did a fantastic job of putting the last one together. She went through the "mine-field" for us.
- * That brought up the budget item of dispersing funds

to the Youth Gardens. Since there was no membership vote, the distribution still has to be voted on. Susan Buckles has received some "wish" lists from the schools. Donations to the Youth Gardens will be distributed depending on their needs. The division and amount to the Youth Gardens will be voted on next meeting.

- * The scholarship fund also has to be determined. Since we do not know how much money we will have, perhaps we should budget only \$1000. Barbara Swanson said if we do that, then make it only one scholarship since \$500 doesn't cover very many expenses. Debra commented that as a community garden club we help the community more by giving to the Youth Gardens.
- * Looking for a place for our wreath making workshop in December. This is just for the club not our money maker. The drought has pretty much canceled that fund raiser for us this year.
- * Ginny said there will be no vote on the proposed budget this meeting because of low attendance because of the Valley Fire. We want most of our members present to vote because of its importance. We had a great "brain-storming" discussion about our proposed budget so next meeting we can finish it up.

STANDING RULES: The changes on the "Standing Rules" was passed out to everyone for discussion. The change is number 9 that states we can take a vote via e-mail. Most comments were against it because in eliminates the "discussion" part of the vote. Some members felt it wasn't necessary to change the rule as our present procedure keeps everyone face-to-face with any issue and seems to work just fine. This will be voted on next meeting.
