For years women were taking Premarin, an estrogen replacement which came from pregnant mare urine, when a health scare hit. It was believed that cancer

was linked to the drug and many women ceased taking Premarin. As a result, the horses that had been raised for that specific purpose were put down.

DiRicco felt she had to do something. She made a trip north and adopted four Percheron draft horses. Though she had never owned driving horses before, the adoption inspired her to begin competing. As these things go, DiRicco now owns 12 Percheron horses, which reside on DiRicco's land in Upper Lake, acquired specifically for them. (Record Bee)
